Delicious meal options from Hillcrest



An Afternoon in the Scenic Loess Hills

The Loess Hills are a rugged narrow band of hills stretching 200 miles along the east edge of the Missouri River Valley. They are formed from wind-blown glacial silt and frequently rise as high as 200 feet. The steep topography and loess soil permeability produce specialized habitats for a variety of plants and animals usually found further west. In 1986, the National Park Service (NPS) designated nearly 10.000 acres as National Natural Landmark sites, and in 1999, Congress commissioned a study to determine if this biologically unique landscape could become a National Park unit. The NPS determined the Loess Hills are nationally significant and suitable for National Park status, but designation of a park unit is not feasible because over 95 percent is privately owned, and many landowners are unwilling to sell to the federal government. Fire suppression has led to the encroachment of invasive red cedar trees, and development is also a threat to the area. Fortunately, many landowners have left the Hills intact. Some public access is available on a patchwork of areas protected as state parks and forests, county conservation areas, and private conservation preserves.

Native prairie grasses and woodlands should make the Hills a colorful place to spend the first afternoon of Autumn. Our first stop will be the Harrison County Historical Museum and Iowa Welcome Center near Missouri Valley to watch a ten minute film on the Loess Hills. We'll spend around an hour at the museum to give everyone a chance to check out the diverse collection ranging from Native American grinding stones to household items belonging to settlers. Many of the artifacts on display are from that area. A log cabin, a one room schoolhouse, and a general store are also open for viewing. The nearby Old Town Conservation Area will be our next destination where we'll hike the trails and take in the sweeping Loess Hills scenery.

Meet at **12:00 noon** on **Sunday**, **September 22**, on the south side of the State Capitol in Lincoln, 15th and H streets, across from the governor's mansion. Participants can either carpool or caravan the 75-mile trip. Bring water, snacks, sturdy walking shoes, insect repellent, and binoculars. We plan to be back in Lincoln by 6:30 p.m., but participants can return earlier. Anyone wanting to join the group at the Iowa Welcome Center located three miles northeast of Missouri Valley on Highway 30 can meet there around 1:30 p.m. There is no charge, and the public is welcome. FEED MIXES

Regal Audubon Mix – sunflower hearts, peanuts, safflower seed, raisins, protein pellets

Standard Audubon Mix – white millet, sunflower seed, cracked corn, peanuts, oat groats

Classic Audubon Mix – sunflower seed/hearts, white millet, cracked corn, safflower seed, peanuts, oat groats

Attraction Audubon Mix – sunflower seed/hearts, safflower seed, peanuts, raisins, protein pellets

Woodpecker Gourmet – 75% nuts (almonds, peanuts, walnuts), pumpkin seed, corn, black oil sunflower seed/hearts, safflower seed

Bushy Tail Treat – peanuts, sunflower seed, whole corn, raisins, pumpkin seed, feed pellets. Treat your favorite backyard squirrels and keep them away from the bird feeders!

SUET CAKES

High Energy Treat – sunflower seeds, millet, cracked corn; enjoyed by most wild birds

Peanut Delight – new no-melt recipe, good for feeding even as the weather warms

SEEDS

White Millet (98%) – popular with cardinals, mourning doves, house finches, juncos, sparrows

Nyjer Thistle – all-time favorite of goldfinches, house and purple finches, chickadees, juncos

Peanuts (shelled) - attractive for woodpeckers and blue jays

Peanuts in the shell – watch your bushy tail friends crack the shells to get to their favorite treat

Safflower Seed – good for house finches, chickadees, cardinals, woodpeckers; NOT FAVORED by squirrels and grackles

Sunflower Hearts – highly prized by birds and leave less mess; use coarse hearts for feeders with large openings that might allow fine hearts to drop out

Black Oil Sunflower Seed – favored by most seed-eating birds; high oil content for more energy
